Outdoor and Context-Based Learning in Ireland: Teaching Through Place, People, and Culture

Dublin (IRELAND)

WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

This course is designed for teachers who would like to explore active and experiential approaches to learning that extend beyond the classroom and connect students to local heritage, cultures and landscapes as a foundation for learning. The course will help participants to find new perspectives and ways to connect diverse curricular areas, while developing the skills and attitudes that support their students' active and responsible participation as European citizens in an increasingly complex, interconnected world.

Language of communication: **English**

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Taking the city, the people, the culture, and nature as our textbook, we will engage in practical activities that promote curiosity, meaningful interaction with the wider learning environment, and learning by doing. The course integrates pedagogical approaches such as Outdoor Learning, Place-Based Learning, and Social and Emotional Learning to demonstrate how extending learning beyond the confines of the classroom can enhance both academic achievement and students' physical and emotional wellbeing.

As part of the course, we will explore European heritage through English Matters' unique *Contexts4Content* approach, strengthening values such as sustainability, inclusion, democratic participation, and respect for diversity, through context-based learning experiences. Participants will reflect on how connecting learners with their local and European environments can cultivate ecological awareness, cultural understanding, and a sense of belonging to the European community.

Objectives:

- To develop understanding of outdoor learning principles and strategies through practical application, exploring how place-based and experiential education enhance student engagement and wellbeing.
- To connect learning with European heritage and citizenship education through our *Contexts4Content* approach, fostering students' environmental responsibility, cultural awareness, and active participation in democratic society.
- To explore effective approaches that connect holistic teaching and learning to real life contexts in Europe.
- To engage in transnational exchange with European colleagues to share innovative practices, build professional networks, and gain diverse perspectives on inclusive and sustainable education.

Methodology:

This course focuses on a practice-based, experiential approach where participants learn *through doing* rather than learning *about* outdoor education. The natural and human-made environments become content and context, with each day focusing on a field experience (*Contexts4Content*) with reflection and pedagogical analysis. In a safe and open-minded space participants will explore places as real-life textbooks where curiosity encourages meaningful and spontaneous learning.



An effective combination of training formats (e.g. *Contexts4Content* field learning projects, interactive workshops, collaborative tasks) will allow participants to explore connections between local environments and broader European heritage and values. Using context-based learning as an integrated cross-curricular approach, teachers will discover how local-to-European connections can be applied in their own teaching contexts.

Assessment will be carried out prior to the course by analysing participants' interests. During the course, frequent oral and written reflection will enhance the learning process. After the course, prospective partnerships might develop from the themes raised by the programme.

LOCATION OF THE COURSE: Dublin (IRELAND)

Dublin, IRELAND, is an old medieval Viking city that displays a fascinating panorama on its streets through a pleasant mix of historic buildings and sites, monuments and street art. Trinity College and the unique Book of Kells, Christ Church Cathedral, Dublin's Viking Castle, the remarkable Chester Beatty Library, or the Samuel Becket Bridge, can be discovered at the same time as the Sweny's pharmacy (immortalized in Joyce's *Ulysses*), where a surprising mix of second-hand books and the famous lemon-scented soap can be found together.

There is no question that **Dublin** is also a warm and welcoming city. Its enjoyable "craic" has attracted visitors for centuries. Traditional music is extremely popular in Ireland and is so easy to find a pub where a band is playing some good drinking music while customers happily join in the chorus.

DURATION OF THE COURSE

7-day course: **40 hours**, starting on Sunday and finishing on Saturday. The **40 hours** duration of the course is applied on average considering all training days of the course, for the implementation of the objectives and lessons.

CERTIFICATION AWARDED

A Certificate will be awarded and will include the name of the participant, description of the course and its learning outcomes, dates and course hours.
