“Structured Educational Visit to Schools & Training Seminars in Estonia”

Tallinn (Estonia)

WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

This structured course is designed for **teachers, head teachers, principals and other school staff** who would like to learn about the Estonian education system within the context of Estonian culture. Although the pedagogic encounters with schools are focused on **Primary and Secondary** levels, other educational sectors may also benefit from the general approach of this course.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Our **7-Day Course** is for those who want to learn about Estonian education and culture through a combination of pedagogic encounters with schools, seminars, field learning projects and workshops. English Matters will select educational institutions related to Primary and Secondary levels. Participants will learn about educational organisation and management of learning and will have the opportunity to share their experience and ideas with colleagues from a variety of schools around the world.

The course offers several **key activities**:

1. Pedagogic encounters with schools to learn about educational organisation and management of learning.
2. Seminars and workshops to explore specific aspects of the education system and culture of Estonia.
3. Professional and cultural discussion resulting in a concluding presentation of learning.
4. Field learning projects to explore places of natural, historical, and cultural significance, as a basis for the development of teaching materials to assist their students in meeting their learning goals and be aware of the socio-cultural richness of Europe.

Objectives:

- Become familiar with relevant aspects of the Estonian education system.
- Learn about examples of teaching practices in schools in Estonia.
- Participate in seminars and workshops related to educational and cultural aspects of Estonian society.
- Participate in field learning projects to places of natural, historical, and cultural significance, to support the development of teaching resources.

This **7-Day Course in Estonia** will allow you to experience the authenticity of the country and its people from the very moment you step foot in the airport.

Allowing yourself to spend enriching days in full contact with Estonian society and culture, and combining this with pedagogic encounters with schools, they will bring you an in-depth understanding of the Estonian education system.

The way in which students are educated can be a window to a deeper vision of society. This can also lead to reflection on why a society educates its people in a certain way and may encourage you to see your own education system from a refreshed perspective.

This combination of elements will help build a holistic vision of education and culture in Estonian from several enriching perspectives.



A NOTE ON THE ESTONIAN EDUCATION SYSTEM

With high scoring on the PISA scale Estonia can be a suggestive destination to learn about an excellent example of achievement by schools, students, and teachers in Europe. These good results are owed to a decentralized and egalitarian education system, to their professional and motivated teachers, and to their investment in innovation and constant learning. Estonians regard their country as the “Education Nation” and feel proud of their promotion of digital skills and creativity. Skype was founded here as well as Wise and Bolt, and excellent EdTech startups like Clanbeat Education, eKool, Opic, Lingvist, or CreamApply are revolutionising the global educational landscape. Schools have a high degree of autonomy to create their curricula and decide on the best teaching and learning methodology. Estonians have always highly regarded their education and with their school curriculum, they favour analysis, synthesis, and evaluation rather than the reproduction of knowledge. Emphasis is placed on problem-solving, critical thinking, entrepreneurship, and digital competences. The ultimate goal is to get students to take an active part in their education and that may be one of the reasons why Estonia has one of the lowest levels of grade repetition in Europe.

LOCATION OF THE COURSE: Tallinn (ESTONIA)

There is much to learn from Estonia as a European country as the history of Estonia is part of the history of Europe. Today, Estonians constitute an EU member state, proud of their independence obtained in 1918, interrupted by the Soviet occupation after World War II, and restored in 1991. This return to independence is well known as The Singing Revolution as it was inspired by the centuries-old tradition of popular song festivals.

Declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 1997, Tallinn has one of the best-preserved medieval fortifications in Europe (its towers and walls maintain the appearance they had in the 14th Century). All this gives the city a medieval fairytale atmosphere in its walls and towers, and in its narrow cobbled streets which lead to mysterious courtyards, romantic cafes, shops, and secret gardens. Tallinn is also a modern city, with modern neighbourhoods full of life with a bohemian atmosphere.

DURATION OF THE COURSE

7-day course: **40 hours**, starting on Sunday and finishing on Saturday. The **40 hours** duration of the course is applied on average considering all training days of the course, for the implementation of the objectives and lessons.

CERTIFICATION AWARDED

A Certificate will be awarded and will include the name of the participant, description of the course and its learning outcomes, dates and course hours.
