WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

This structured course is designed for **teachers, head teachers, principals and other school staff** who would like to learn about the Irish education system within the context of Irish culture. Although the pedagogic encounters with schools are focused on **Primary, Secondary** and **Vocational** levels, other educational sectors may also benefit from the general approach of this course.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Our **7-Day Course** is for those who want to learn about Irish education and culture through a combination of pedagogic encounters with schools, seminars, field projects “Contexts4Content”, and workshops.

English Matters will select educational institutions related to Primary, Secondary and Vocational school levels. Participants will learn about educational organisation and management of learning and will have the opportunity to share their experience and ideas with colleagues from a variety of schools around the world.

The course offers several **key activities**:

1. Pedagogic encounters with schools to learn about educational organisation and management of learning.
2. Seminars and workshops to explore specific aspects of the education system and culture of Ireland.
3. Professional and cultural discussion resulting in a concluding presentation of learning.
4. Field learning projects “Contexts4Content” as a basis for the development of teaching materials to assist their students in meeting their learning goals and be aware of the socio-cultural richness of Europe.

Objectives:

- Become familiar with relevant aspects of the Irish education system.
- Learn about examples of teaching practices in schools in Ireland.
- Participate in seminars and workshops related to educational and cultural aspects of Irish society.
- Participate in field projects “Contexts4Content” to places of natural, historical, and cultural significance, to support the development of teaching resources.

This **7-Day Course in Ireland** will allow you to experience the authenticity of the country and its people from the very moment you step foot in the airport.

Allowing yourself to spend enriching days in full contact with Irish society and culture and combining this with pedagogic encounters with schools, will bring you an in-depth understanding of the Irish education system.

The way in which students are educated can be a window to a deeper vision of society. This can also lead to reflection on why a society educates its people in a certain way and may encourage you to see your own education system from a refreshed perspective.

This combination of elements will help build a holistic vision of education and culture in Ireland from several enriching perspectives.

A NOTE ON THE IRISH EDUCATION SYSTEM

Education is considered a central pillar in the economic, social, and cultural development of Irish society, in such a way that both authorities and social agents clearly see it as strategically linked to national development. The **Irish education system** has always been highly valued by the public. The primary school curriculum is fully child centered, and the secondary education with its Junior and a Senior Cycles presents a stimulating Transition Year (a year of maturation, without formal exams, where students can enjoy a wide range of educational inputs, including work experience). In terms of achievements in higher education, Ireland has a reputation as one of the best educational systems in the world. Irish students perform in the best sectors in international studies such as PISA assessments, and employers, both national and international, affirm the quality of the professional level of graduates of the Irish education system. Further Education and Vocational Training presents a unique design in Ireland: The Vocational Training Opportunities Scheme, and the Youthreach programs, complete the panorama of a remarkably interesting educational offer in Ireland.

LOCATION OF THE COURSE: Dublin (IRELAND)

Dublin is an old medieval Viking city that displays a fascinating panorama on its streets through a pleasant mix of historic buildings and sites, monuments and street art. Trinity College and the unique Book of Kells, Christ Church Cathedral, Dublin's Viking Castle, the remarkable Chester Beatty Library, or the Samuel Beckett Bridge, can be discovered at the same time as Sweny's pharmacy (immortalized in Joyce's Ulysses), where a surprising mix of second-hand books and lemon-scented soap can be found together.

Dublin is also a warm and welcoming city. Its enjoyable "craic" has attracted visitors for centuries. Traditional music is extremely popular in Ireland, and it is so easy to find a pub where a band is playing some good drinking music while customers happily join in the chorus.

DURATION OF THE COURSE

7-day course: **40 hours**, starting on Sunday and finishing on Saturday. The **40 hours** duration of the course is applied on average considering all training days of the course, for the implementation of the objectives and lessons.

CERTIFICATION AWARDED

A Certificate will be awarded and will include the name of the participant, description of the course and its learning outcomes, dates and course hours.
