WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

This structured course is designed for **teachers, head teachers, principals and other school staff** who would like to learn about the Spanish education system within the context of Spanish culture. Although the pedagogic encounters with schools are focused on **Primary, Secondary** and **Vocational** levels, other educational sectors may also benefit from the general approach of this course.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Our **7-Day Structured Course** is for those who want to learn about Spanish education and culture through a combination of pedagogic encounters with schools, seminars, field learning projects and workshops.

English Matters will select educational institutions related to Primary, Secondary and Vocational school levels. Participants will learn about educational organisation and management of learning and will have the opportunity to share their experience and ideas with colleagues from a variety of schools around the world.

The course offers several **key activities**:

1. Pedagogic encounters with schools to learn about educational organisation and management of learning.
2. Seminars and workshops to explore specific aspects of the education system and culture of Spain.
3. Professional and cultural discussion resulting in a concluding presentation of learning.
4. Field learning projects to explore places of natural, historical, and cultural significance, as a basis for the development of teaching materials to assist their students in meeting their learning goals and be aware of the socio-cultural richness of Europe.

Objectives:

- Become familiar with relevant aspects of the Spanish education system.
- Learn about examples of teaching practices in schools in Spain.
- Participate in seminars and workshops related to educational and cultural aspects of Spanish society.
- Participate in field learning projects to places of natural, historical, and cultural significance, to support the development of teaching resources.

This **7-Day Structured Course in Spain** will allow you to experience the authenticity of the country and its people from the very moment you step foot in the airport.

Allowing yourself to spend enriching days in full contact with Spanish society and culture and combining this with pedagogic encounters with schools, will bring you an in-depth understanding of the Spanish education system.

The way in which students are educated can be a window to a deeper vision of society. This can also lead to reflection on why a society educates its people in a certain way and may encourage you to see your own education system from a refreshed perspective. This combination of elements will help build a holistic vision of education and culture in Spain.

A NOTE ON THE SPANISH EDUCATION SYSTEM

The elegance, passion and history present in the art, literature, architecture, and people of Spain filters through all levels of their culture, including the **Spanish education system**. Spain is always creating, adapting, and looking for inspiration to produce a deep curriculum balancing content, humanity, and variety. The OECD reports highlight the good atmosphere of cordiality in Spanish schools. Spanish students' sense of belonging is one of the highest among PISA-participating countries. The closeness and friendly relationship between teachers and students, and the commendable work of teachers are key to improving academic results. Vocational Training offers enormous quality with excellent plans increasingly oriented to the needs of the present and future labour market. Many Primary and Secondary schools accredit also quality bilingual teaching. Spain is also one of the preferred destinations for foreign students.

LOCATION OF THE COURSE: Málaga (SPAIN)

Málaga is the capital of the Costa del Sol with unique museums, charming pedestrian areas, a wonderful beach, and breathtaking views. The opening of the Picasso Museum in 2003 marked the beginning of Málaga's cultural renaissance. With excellent transportation links, exceptional cuisine and a wealth of historical landmarks from Moorish and Roman eras to the present day, Málaga is a busy city with both locals and tourists alike all enjoying the charming Andalusian atmosphere.

Participants can tap into Málaga's rich cultural and historical heritage by exploring its rich tapestry of landmarks including the ancient Moorish fortress, the Alcazaba; the Gibralfaro Castle, with its stunning views and surroundings; the Picasso Museum, among many other places of cultural significance.

DURATION OF THE COURSE

7-day course: **40 hours**, starting on Sunday and finishing on Saturday. The **40 hours** duration of the course is applied on average considering all training days of the course, for the implementation of the objectives and lessons.

CERTIFICATION AWARDED

A Certificate will be awarded and will include the name of the participant, description of the course and its learning outcomes, dates and course hours.
