WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

This structured course is designed for **teachers, head teachers, principals and other school staff** who would like to learn about the Portuguese education system within the context of Portuguese culture. Although the pedagogic encounters with schools are focused on **Primary** and **Secondary** levels, other educational sectors may also benefit from the general approach of this course.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Our **7-Day Course** is for those who want to learn about Portuguese education and culture through a combination of pedagogic encounters with schools, seminars, field learning “Contexts4Content”, and workshops.

English Matters will select educational institutions related to Primary and Secondary school levels. Participants will learn about educational organisation and management of learning and will have the opportunity to share their experience and ideas with colleagues from a variety of schools around the world.

The course offers several **key activities**:

1. Pedagogic encounters with schools to learn about educational organisation and management of learning.
2. Seminars and workshops to explore specific aspects of the education system and culture of Portugal.
3. Professional and cultural discussion resulting in a concluding presentation of learning.
4. Field projects “Contexts4Content” to explore places of natural, historical, and cultural significance, as a basis for the development of teaching materials to assist their students in meeting their learning goals and be aware of the socio-cultural richness of Europe.

Objectives:

- Become familiar with relevant aspects of the Portuguese education system.
- Learn about examples of teaching practices in schools in Portugal.
- Participate in seminars and workshops related to educational and cultural aspects of Portuguese society.
- Participate in field projects “Contexts4Content” to places of natural, historical, and cultural significance, to support the development of teaching resources.

This **7-Day Course in Portugal** will allow you to experience the authenticity of the country and its people from the very moment you step foot in the airport.

Allowing yourself to spend enriching days in full contact with Portuguese society and culture, and combining this with pedagogic encounters with schools, will bring you an in-depth understanding of the Portuguese education system.

The way in which students are educated can be a window to a deeper vision of society. This can also lead to reflection on why a society educates its people in a certain way and may encourage you to see your own

education system from a refreshed perspective. This combination of elements will help build a holistic vision of education and culture in Portugal.

DURATION OF THE COURSE

7-day course: **40 hours**, starting on Sunday and finishing on Saturday. The **40 hours** duration of the course is applied on average considering all training days of the course, for the implementation of the objectives and lessons.

CERTIFICATION AWARDED

A Certificate will be awarded and will include the name of the participant, description of the course and its learning outcomes, dates and course hours.
