“Structured Educational Visit to Schools & Training Seminars in Sweden”

Stockholm (Sweden)

WHO IS THIS COURSE FOR?

This structured course is designed for **teachers, head teachers, principals and other school staff** who would like to learn about the Swedish education system within the context of Swedish culture. Although the pedagogic encounters with schools are focused on **Primary, Secondary** and **Vocational** levels, other educational levels may also benefit from the general approach of this course.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

Our **7-Day Course** is for those who want to learn about Swedish education and culture through a combination of pedagogic encounters with schools, seminars, field projects “Contexts4Content”, and workshops.

English Matters will select educational institutions related to Primary and Secondary levels. Participants will learn about educational organisation and management of learning and will have the opportunity to share their experience and ideas with colleagues from a variety of schools around the world.

The course offers several **key activities**:

1. Pedagogic encounters with schools to learn about educational organisation and management of learning.
2. Seminars and workshops to explore specific aspects of the education system and culture of Sweden.
3. Professional and cultural discussion resulting in a concluding presentation of learning.
4. Field projects “Contexts4Content” to explore places of natural, historical, and cultural significance, as a basis for the development of teaching materials to assist their students in meeting their learning goals and be aware of the socio-cultural richness of Europe.

Objectives:

- Become familiar with relevant aspects of the Swedish education system.
- Learn about examples of teaching practices in schools in Sweden.
- Participate in seminars and workshops related to educational and cultural aspects of Swedish society.
- Participate in field learning projects “Contexts4Content” to places of natural, historical, and cultural significance, to support the development of teaching resources.

This **7-Day Course in Sweden** will allow you to experience the authenticity of the country and its people from the very moment you step foot in the airport.

Allowing yourself to spend enriching days in full contact with Swedish society and culture, and combining this with pedagogic encounters with schools, will bring you an in-depth understanding of the Swedish education system.

The way in which students are educated can be a window to a deeper vision of society. This can also lead to reflection on why a society educates its people in a certain way and may encourage you to see your own education system from a refreshed perspective. This combination of elements will help build a holistic vision of education and culture in Sweden.

A NOTE ON THE SWEDISH EDUCATION SYSTEM

The **Swedish education system** is committed to the purpose of educating young people to become active citizens. You will notice this in the way students work and participate in activities, and how schools foster an interest in democracy and citizenship. This idea has influenced education in Sweden for many years and has produced a system which stands out for its focus on freedom, democracy, diversity, equality, and sustainability, and is based on the idea of making opportunities for success more equitable for students, regardless of gender or socio-cultural background. In the Swedish education system, both the public and private sectors receive the same budget and students can choose any public or private school at no cost for them. Highly qualified teachers make a difference, and it is generally accepted that the chances of students being successful in school are more equal in Sweden than elsewhere.

LOCATION OF THE COURSE: Stockholm (SWEDEN)

Stockholm is a beautiful city which stands virtually on water (the city is often called the Venice of the North because of its canals). The City of Stockholm is formed by an archipelago comprising 14 islands that connect to the Baltic Sea through Lake Mälaren. The city has a rich history visible in its architecture, museums, Royal Palace and the medieval quarter of Gamla Stan. Bridges connect the different islands of Stockholm, making the city a joy to walk. Stockholm is the cultural, political, and economic capital city of Sweden and the most populated urban area in the country and in all of Scandinavia.

DURATION OF THE COURSE

7-day course: **40 hours**, starting on Sunday and finishing on Saturday. The **40 hours** duration of the course is applied on average considering all training days of the course, for the implementation of the objectives and lessons.

CERTIFICATION AWARDED

A Certificate will be awarded and will include the name of the participant, description of the course and its learning outcomes, dates and course hours.
